Iraqi Communists assures that CIA is behind the indiscriminate attacks

Iraqi Communists assure that CIA is behind the indiscriminate attacks

The Union of the Iraqi people, organization who proclaims her opposition to the American military occupation, has accused the Central Agency of Intelligence (CIA) of the United States to be behind the attacks in Iraq To thus he has affirmed today in press conference in the Spanish city of Cordova the spokesman it of the Union of the Iraqi People, Jousif Hamdan, that has assured that the Iraqi resistance to the occupation, to which the Communists support and collaboration, "is being disqualified" by the United States when tying it with the indiscriminate attacks, whereas, in fact, "when there are dead civilians it must to the action of the company". Hamdan, which he makes a tour by Andalusia to the object to present the version the Iraqi Communists on the conflict in which its country is immersed, has explained that the company is the person in charge of the organization and actions that they execute.

The spokesman of the Union of the Iraqi People has clarified in addition that the resistance foreigners of islamista cut do not form, but is integrated "in a 99 percent by Iraqi and he is not suní, since they want to make believe the Americans", being the military (350.000) of the previous army of Iraq those who largely compose it, along with Muslim and nationalistic Iraqis (of the Baas party), in addition to Communists, forming what Hamdan has denominated the "Muslim and Democratic Front of Iraq", that looks for "its freedom".

Los comunistas de Iraq dicen que muchos de los atentados contra la población civil los organiza la CIA

Agencias/ inSurGente.- El portavoz comunista de la Unión del Pueblo Iraquí, **Jousif Hamdan**, en rueda de prensa en la ciudad andaluza de Córdoba, ha

dejado claro que muchos de los atentados contra civiles que se producen en su país, obedecen a una estrategia perfectamente diseñada por la CIA. Lo hacen "grupos de bandidos, para así descalificar a la resistencia iraquí y justificar la ocupación", añadió Hamdan. La Unión del Pueblo Iraquí forma parte de la heterogénea resistencia armada en Iraq, y sus declaraciones de lo que allí ocurre son más que interesantes. Simplemente pinchando en leer más, tendrán acceso, de primera mano, a la opinión de una organización revolucionaria y marxista, que combate, junto a otras muchas, contra el imperialismo.

Los comunistas de Iraq, integrados en la Unión del Pueblo Iraquí, organización que proclama su oposición a la ocupación militar estadounidense de su país, consideraron hoy que la Agencia Central de Inteligencia (CIA) de Estados Unidos está detrás de los atentados terroristas en Iraq, en los que perecen hombres, mujeres y niños.

Así lo afirmó hoy en rueda de prensa desde Córdoba el portavoz de la Unión del Pueblo Iraquí, Jousif Hamdan, quien aseguró que la resistencia iraquí a la ocupación, a la que los comunistas prestan apoyo y colaboración, "está siendo descalificada" por los Estados Unidos al vincularla con los atentados terroristas indiscriminados, mientras que, en realidad, "cuando hay muertos civiles se debe a la acción de la CIA".

Hamdan, que realiza una gira por Andalucía, con el apoyo del PCA, al objeto de dar a conocer la versión de los comunistas iraquíes sobre el conflicto en el que está inmerso su país, explicó que la CIA es la responsable de la organización y acciones terroristas que ejecutan "grupos de bandidos, para así descalificar a la resistencia iraquí y justificar la ocupación", en base a los atentados terroristas indiscriminados, de los que desvinculó a su organización argumentando que "hay actos que nosotros no justificamos".

Para dejar más clara la postura de la Unión del Pueblo Iraquí sobre esta cuestión, su portavoz aseguró, respecto al 11-M, que "los iraquíes no odian ni sienten rencor contra España y no aceptamos actos como éste, con el que tampoco tenemos ninguna relación".

En este sentido, Hamdan recordó que en nombre de su organización, que no está integrada en el actual Gobierno de Irak y que rechaza la Constitución emanada del mismo por ser fruto de "un gobierno que colabora con la ocupación", ya envió un telegrama al presidente del Gobierno español, José Luis Rodríguez Zapatero, "agradeciéndole la retirada de las tropas españolas de Iraq, lo cual es un ejemplo de la relación de amistad que nos une al pueblo español, pues tenemos claro que la acción de Aznar, en unión de Blair y Bush, no representa a lo que quiere el pueblo español".

Por otro lado, Hamdan dijo que el autodenominado Partido Comunista Iraquí, integrado en el actual Gobierno de dicho país, "no representa al movimiento comunista de Irak, a donde llegó de la mano de la ocupación, con la que colabora facilitando información a la CIA sobre la ubicación de los núcleos de la resistencia".

El portavoz de la Unión del Pueblo Iraquí aclaró además que la resistencia no la forman terroristas extranjeros de corte islamista, sino está integrada "en un 99% por iraquíes y no es suní, como quieren hacer creer los estadounidenses", siendo militares (350.000) del anterior ejército de Irak los que en buena medida la componen, junto con musulmanes y nacionalistas iraquíes (del partido Baas), además de comunistas, formando lo que Hamdan denominó el "Frente Musulmán y Democrático de Iraq", que busca "su liberación".

The occupation forces are the real perpetrators of bomb attacks in Iraq?

Iran's top military commander accused the United States and Israel of planning the non-stop bomb attacks that killed thousands of civilians in Iraq.

Brigadier General Mohammad-Baqer Zolqadr, the deputy commander of Iran's Islamic Revolutionary Guards Corps (IRGC), told a gathering of senior officials, that the U.S. needs those attacks to justify the continuation of its military presence in Iraq.

"The Americans blame weak and feeble groups in Iraq for insecurity in this

country. We do not believe this and we have information that the insecurity has its roots in the activities of American and Israeli spies," Zolqadr said.

"Insecurity in Iraq is a deeply-rooted phenomenon. The root of insecurity in Iraq lies in the occupation of this country by foreigners".

"If Iraq is to become secure, there will be no room for the occupiers".

Zolqadr also said that the U.S. forces pursue "important and strategic goals in their continuing occupation of Iraq".

The U.S. wanted to remain in Iraq to "plunder the country's wealth, bring the Middle East under its control, and create security for Israel, which is on the verge of annihilation".

Zolqadr, moreover, noted that dozens of new U.S. military are being built in Iraq "for this reason they are constantly creating insecurity".

The U.S.-occupation authority has repeatedly claimed that the Iraqi security forces are not ready yet to protect the country against rebel attacks, with the aim of defending the continued heavy presence of U.S. troops there even after an Iraqi government was elected.
